Our past students are studying for a wide range of undergraduate and postgraduate degrees including: medicine, international law, chemistry, business management, IT & computer science, biosciences, nursing, education, art & design, sociology and environmental sciences. Some students from our first cohorts have already completed their degrees and have entered the workplace or pursuing higher education studying for Masters and Doctoral degrees.
